

Changes to ICTE's English courses

What are the changes taking place within the University?

The Institute of Continuing and TESOL Education (ICTE) is merging with [UQ College](#) (UQC). Before this merger can take place, UQC must obtain CRICOS registration. In the interim, the courses currently provided by ICTE will be temporarily transferred to The University of Queensland's (UQ) CRICOS registration.

What is CRICOS registration?

The Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) is the official register of all Australian education providers that are permitted to offer courses to students studying in Australia on student visas. A provider is not permitted to offer courses to these students without CRICOS registration. The provider receives a CRICOS registration number and the courses offered are given CRICOS codes.

What do these changes mean for me?

The only change for your course is the CRICOS code. Your Bridging English or General English/English for Academic Purposes course will continue to be taught by staff from ICTE and the content, and your experience, will be the same. There will be no change to your progression to UQ afterwards if you meet the requirements.

What do I need to do?

Unless you have not yet accepted your offer, you do not need to do anything.

If you are still studying your English course, we will write to you to let you know when the courses are transferred to UQC's CRICOS registration.
