- Participation in orientations, student consultations and supervision of student activities
- Reporting on student academic progress and liaising with academic support staff, as required.
- Participation in continuing professional development
- General course administration at the direction of the relevant Academic Manager

Schedule 1: Rates of Pay

Teaching Contact Work

For Teaching Contact work at UQ College, casual teachers are paid at a higher hourly rate than the rate of pay under the Educational Services (Post-Secondary Education) Award 2020. This is in acknowledgment of the high expectations relating to teaching quality for teachers at UQ College. (See Appendix 1 for definition of Teaching Contact work)

Pathway Teaching Contact Work

When teaching contact hours on a TESOL pathway program (e.g., BE, and IE), casual TESOL teachers will be paid an additional 10% loading rate on top of the Teaching Contact hourly rate in acknowledgment of the additional feedback associated with teaching on these programs.

Base Rate (Non-teaching contact work)

The Base Rate applies to all Non-teaching Contact work (See Appendix 1 for definition). It will be paid at the appropriate casual hourly rate specified in the Modern Award.

Casual TESOL Teacher – Rates of Pay

Teaching Contact and Non-teaching contact rates for Casual TESOL teachers at UQ College as set out in Table 1 below shall be paid according to the following tiered salary scale.
